The construction of a descriptive profile of slave executions is important because analyses of capital punishment in the United States have not delineated the socio-historical relevance of slavery to the execution of blacks. United States of America's death penalty laws and how they are applied, including death row and execution numbers, death-eligible crimes, methods of execution, appeals and clemency, availability of lawyers, prison conditions, ratification of international instruments, and recent developments. While some states in the U.S. retain the death penalty, not all states' criminal codes retain it, and thus categorizing the U.S. as homogeneously retentionist does not accurately reflect the legal status of the death penalty in the country as a whole. Within the limits defined by the Constitution, each state applies its own criminal law.
