The government was highly ineffective in insulating the economy from the volatility in the global oil market. This volatility often translated into fluctuations in government expenditure, real exchange rate, and GDP growth. In an attempt to promote fiscal prudence and management, Nigeria established a stabilisation fund; known as the Excess Crude Account and adopted an oil-based fiscal rule. The adoption of these fiscal mechanisms succeeded in delinking fiscal spending at all levels
