## Abstract

The newest addition to the Point/Counterpoint Series, *Abortion: Three Perspectives* features a debate between four noted philosophers - Michael Tooley, Celia Wolf-Devine, Philip E. Devine, and Alison M. Jaggar - presenting different perspectives on one of the most socially and politically argued issues of the past 30 years. 
