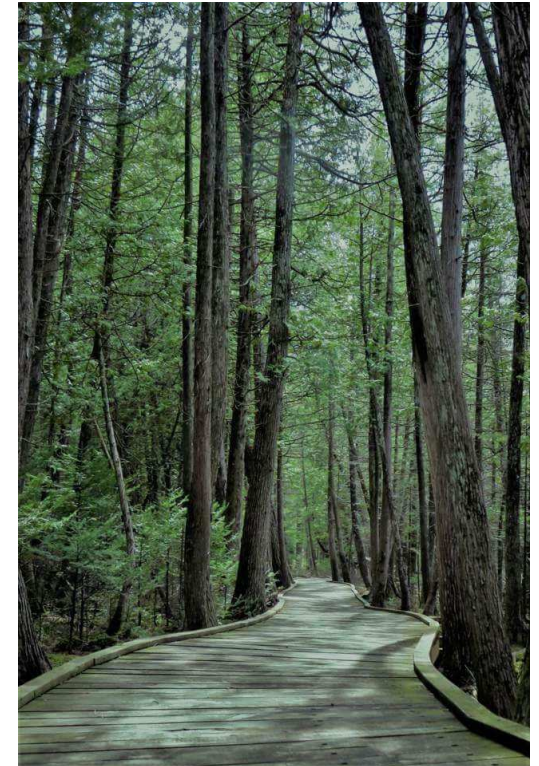
Look for the Camp au Sable arrowhead sign on the right (after going under the I-75 overpass).
