In the United States, statistics from the early 21st century compiled by the National Institute on Deafness and Other Communication Disorders revealed that approximately 5 percent of American children had detectable speech disorders by age six or seven. About 7.5 million Americans were found to be unable to use their voice normally. Studies of stuttering that have focused on specific populations, including Americans, Europeans, and Africans, have indicated that the prevalence of the disorder among these populations is highly variable.
