Assessment is a key component of nursing practice, required for planning and provision of patient and family centred care. The Nursing and Midwifery Board of Australia (NMBA) in the national competency standard for registered nurses states that nurses, "Conducts a comprehensive and systematic nursing assessment, plans nursing care in consultation with individuals/ groups, significant others & the interdisciplinary health care team and responds effectively to unexpected or rapidly changing situations. Aim." However the clinical need of the assessment should also be considered against the need for the child to rest. In the adolescent patient it is important to consider completing psychosocial assessments as physical, emotional and social well-being are closely interlinked.
