Affluent workers supported the Labour Party for individual gain and their attitude to trade unions was instrumental. Unlike the traditional working class, they weren't motivated by working class solidarity or the idea of sticking together. How did Fiona Devine study the affluent workers? She revisited Luton to explore how far working class people's lifestyles were privatised in the 1980's. She carried out intensive interviews with 62 Luton residents between 1986 and 1987.
