Its foundation was postponed for 17 years compared to Aristotle University. According to the album "63 years of Medical School", the difficulty of the elected professors to travel from Athens, their dismissal and reassessment after the liberation and the infrastructure deficiencies were some of the major problems that the new Medical School had to face.
