Gutmann.Â This social history of the pre-industrial revolution in early modern Europe emphasizes the interrelatedness of social, economic, and demographic change and demonstrates that there was a logic of industrial change that made the introduction of factories a likely outcome of earlier developments. Myron P. Gutmann traces the history of industry from the guild-dominated medieval urban organizations to their replacement by rural cottage industry and then, at the end of the eighteenth century, to the construction of factories.
