HUMAN REMAINS. It is clear from the animal bones at countless sites that meat was a staple diet of Palaeolithic man in Europe (Saffirio, 1975). However, it is likely that, in some periods, plants were also of great importance to man, and indeed may have constituted the bulk of the food consumed, in terms of weight. Lack of preservation prevents a more accurate assessment of the relative contributions to diet of meat and plants, and one must turn to human remains for clues here.Â
