The purpose of this study is to determine the perspectives of teachers who have completed We do not provide licensure, registration or certification services for individuals. However, throughout our history, we have contributed significantly to the education of students who later seek official recognition of their qualifications to serve the public. In the United States, for example, where licensure for the engineering and surveying professions is regulated at the state level, graduation from an ABET-accredited program is almost universally required to validate the educational experience of applicants. State licensure/certification is required for most counseling practitioners. Exceptions include some entry level positions and supportive administrative counseling positions, such as a case worker. However most counseling fields require a license or certification to practice and accept insurance payments. Counseling licensure/certification requirements vary depending on the type of counseling you are practicing and the state in which you practice.
