The guidance in California Preschool Learning Foundations is not binding on local educational agencies or other entities. Except for the statutes, regulations, and court decisions that are referenced herein, the document is exemplary, and compliance with it is not mandatory. (See Education Code Section 33308.5.) When the child's behaviour does not fit with what is appropriate for the child's developmental level, and is frequent or extreme, it is important to try to discover the reasons for the behaviour. Children's behaviour must be understood in the context of one's own expectations about what is "challenging" whilst considering children's developmental level. For children over preschool age the aim is to empower them to make favourable choices, develop positive and respectful relationships and to reflect and act upon what is fair and equitable.
